Kingston Hub Social Innovation Programme: Challenge Brief

The Challenge

The challenge is to generate a wide participation base for the North Kingston Forum which covers Canbury and Tudor wards.

About us: The North Kingston Forum is a group of people who live or work in our neighbourhood area covering North Kingston, with the express purpose of promoting or improving the social, economic and environmental wellbeing of the area through the development of a Neighbourhood Plan. We want to work with our local communities, councillors, planners and developers to retain and enhance the character of North Kingston by developing a Neighbourhood Plan (NPlan) that will be a vehicle to guide, promote and allow balanced and sustainable change within our designated Neighborurhood Area.

In order to create an NPlan, the neighbourhood forum has to ensure it consults with the widest range of those who live or work in the area. An NPlan is a legal document and as such must reflect the views and opinions of the wider community. Once created and found to be sound by planning inspectors, the community has the opportunity to vote on the plan at referendum and, if they vote 'yes', it becomes a part of the council's borough wide Local Plan. Any future land use planning applications in that neighbourhood would then be judged against both the Local Plan and the NPlan, thus the NPlan adds more weight to community views.

Our Neighbourhood Area has a distinct identity and is locally referred to as North Kingston. Whilst predominantly residential and with a population of ~23,000, the area also contains many local businesses, shops, schools, recreation facilities and open spaces. How do we reach out to all groups in the community to both inform and consult? We need to develop a strategy to reach out to all groups proving hard to reach which include:

Youth/Parents, Elderly, Ethnic minorities, Disabled, Carers

The key outcomes for this assignment are to:

- 1. Identify key Organisations and appropriate contacts for, or who work with people in those groups
- 2. Develop a strategy to increase the participation for each hard to reach group
- 3. Work with the Forum in establishing an effective link with those hard to reach groups

The key steps likely to be taken in the assignment are:

- 1. Research council/organisational websites etc to determine key groups and contacts
- 2. Identify routes to increase the participation of each group, ie social media, interest groups, community groups/social groups etc
- 3. Work with the Forum to create:
 - A small 'key contact' database (Excel Spreadsheet style)
 - an information letter/invitation to both inform and encourage participation, and promote the advantages of neighbourhood planning.

Opportunities going forwards

As we progress through the development of our NPlan, further volunteering opportunities may arise in 2018 to help with eg, developing surveys, or helping with survey data analysis.
